Sent in Humility

June 25, 2023 | Luke 22:24-27

Wherever we are sent to serve, we are to adopt a heart of a learner, listener, and servant.



1) Use your God-given gifts in a way that serves/uplifts others.

The intersection of your interests, gifts/talents, and passion.

2) Serve in a way that honours God and gives God the glory.

True Compassion:

- We recognize suffering and realize we are a part of it and not separate from it (Matthew 9:36)
- We want to make/see a change (Matthew 6:10)
- We don't expect anything in return (Luke 6:35)

3) Serve in a way that leaves space for “perspective shifts”, growth and learning.

Reflect + Apply

What are the places in which you have been sent to serve? What does it look like for you, to have a heart of a learner, listener and servant in each of those spaces?

What is a perspective shift that you have experienced in your journey with Jesus?

Who comes to mind, whom you have seen model humility or be a servant leader?

Draw your own venn diagram and explore the interests, gifts, talents and passions that God has given you. How are these shaping your daily life and ministry? What is a longing on your heart that you can offer to God?
